*Abstract:* Public Sector Undertakings – Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes persons appointed on provisional basis and were in Service as on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1984 – Retention of – Orders issued.

### ORDER

In the Circular read as first paper above all the Public Sector Undertakings were requested to retain in service the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe employees who were in service on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1984, even if their term of 180 days had expired.

2. It has been brought to the notice of Government that the service of some of the employees to whom benefit of the circular would have applied had been terminated either due to want of vacancies or to accommodate regular recruits of the Public Service Commission.

3. Government have considered the matter and are pleased to order as follows:

(i) The Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe provisional employees who were eligible for continuances as per the circular cited but who had to be retrenched for want of vacancies will be reappointed in any available open vacancy in the Public Sector Undertaking concerned.

(ii) Where no open vacancies are available the Public Sector Undertakings concerned will create supernumerary posts to reappoint the retrenched Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe provisional employees. Supernumerary posts will also be created in cases where retrenchment is inevitable when the nominees of the Public Service Commission report for duty against the vacancies reported to the Commission before the issue of the circular dated 11<sup>th</sup> October 1984.

(iii) The supernumerary posts so created, will be adjusted against vacancies, arising in future.
